### 2023 theme: Digital learning for greening education

Funded by the Kingdom of Bahrain and established in 2005, the Prize awards annually US\$ 25,000 each to two innovative projects that use digital technologies to enhance teaching, learning, and overall education performance.



### **UNESCO ICT in Education Prize: 2023 edition**

At the Transforming Education Summit 2022, public digital learning and greening education were underscored as two priority areas in advancing the Sustainable Development Goal 4 agenda. Digital learning, with its potential to expand access and improve the quality of learning, offers an avenue for the delivery of curricula and pedagogy to equip learners with the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes on climate change and take climate actions.

Within this context, the 2023 edition of the UNESCO ICT in Education Prize is dedicated to the theme "Digital learning for greening education". It aims to surface and maximize the impact of best practices in leveraging digital technologies to develop competencies and forge an active commitment to sustainable development among learners.

#### Who can apply?

Individuals, institutions, non-governmental organizations or other entities.

#### **Eligibility criteria**

- Be relevant to the theme
- Be ongoing for at least 1 year
- Not to be affiliated with UNESCO or receive any funding from UNESCO
- The project should be public and free of charge

#### **Selection criteria**

- Appropriateness of digital solutions
- Pedagogy innovation
- Inclusion and equity
- Evidence of impact
- Potential for replicability and scalability

  5 February 2024 (midnight, Paris time).

#### Who can nominate?

- Governments of the Member States of UNESCO, via their National Commissions, and Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) in official partnership with UNESCO can make up to 3 nominations.
- Self-nominations are not accepted.
